## Profiles

H.E. Carlos Alberto Peré Aguirre is the Ambassador of the Republic of Panama to Japan and Consul-General in Tokyo. He arrived to Japan in October 2019 and presented his credentials to Emperor Naruhito in March 2020. Before joining the public service, he had worked in private companies, from retail and telecommunication sectors. He graduated from the Faculty of Industrial Engineering of the Latin American University of Science and Technology (ULACIT - *Universidad Latinoamericana de Ciencia y Tecnología*). He has also completed his studies at the Leadership Program of ADEN International Business School in Panama.

Dr. Ritter Díaz, former Ambassador of Panama to Japan (November 2014-October 2019), currently serves as an independent consultant in Tokyo, advising companies how to conduct business between Japan and Latin America in the areas of export/import, tourism, financial services, real estate and governmental relations. He is also the Representative Director of the Japan Association for the Promotion of Latin America and Caribbean (JAPOLAC). He received his Master's Degree in International Political Economy, with specialization in Regional Integration, from the Graduate School of International Political Economy of Tsukuba University, where he also pursued Doctoral studies. He was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from Chiba University.

B.A. in Law Georgette Constantino currently works as Second Secretary at the Embassy of Panama to Japan. Before her arrival to Japan in 2018, she worked as technical analyst in the Consulate Department, the Bureau of Human Rights of the General Direction of Organizations and International Conferences and the General Direction of Foreign Policy. She has worked in the Ministry of Commerce and Industry for over 6 years as legal adviser and investment promoter, as well. She is a penal lawyer, who obtained her Bachelor Degree in Law and Political Sciences from the University of Panama. She also did postgraduate studies in Top Management at the University of the Isthmus (*la Universidad del Istmo*).
